Introduction

This resource is intended to provide inspiration when it comes to adding sensory details into your writing, breaking down each of the main senses – vision, sound, taste, smell, touch – into subcategories to get you thinking about the complex options you have as a writer when bringing each sense to the page. There is also a short final section which focuses on the internal senses of heat, pain, balance and self. This resource is not intended as an exhaustive thesaurus but simply as a handy starting point to help you bring the world of your stories to life.
